They received guidance on using techniques like Cornell notes, flashcards, and revision plans, as well as tips on interview skills and teamwork. with sixth formers to boost results.

St Martin's School, in Hanging Hill Lane, Brentwood, is working with Study Skills Zone to support Year 12 and 13 students to learn independently.

Based on the work of leading educators, psychologists, memory champions and authors, the Bright memory Futures programme gives young people a toolbox of revision strategies and self-management skills.

Graham Samuels joined the school last month as deputy head teacher with responsibility for the sixth form.

He immediately set about helping students to dig deep and find the information they have already stored and to teach them ways to retain further knowledge to support them with their learning.

He said: "As a student, I had lots of notes and did not know what to do with them. I found myself focusing on things I already knew and writing

that out again and again which was sion techniques are being shared not effective. Students do that and hope the information is going in.

"These workshops tap into cognitive science around revision, with proven methods around what we do with study notes and how to prepare for mastery across different topics."

Mr Samuels, and the workshops, focus on the Five Rs of Review. Reformat, Reduce, Recall and Repeat.

Within each R are ten to 20 ideas of how to improve your revision technique.

Mr Samuels said: "I am keen to work with our students to add value to their outcomes. I want to see more structure to their revision.

"The aim is to embed study skills systematically throughout their two years in sixth form. In fact, we want to even start that before Year 12, so there is a gradual progression from Year 7 onwards.

"We want to be constantly upskilling students to make the best use of their free time."
