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#### STEM Careers in the NHS

On Monday 25 November, selected pupils in Years 9, 10, 12 and 13 participated in a STEM Careers workshop for Pupils engaged in a number of activities designed to open their eyes to the 350+ different jobs within the NHS. Pupils took part in activities to develop key transferable skills, such as communication. During the final task, pupils were asked to listen to their partners' instructions on how to model an animal out of plasticine, that they were unable to see. This task demonstrated the importance of listening but also how to give clear instructions. We hope the pupils enjoyed the session and left informed of the various NHS careers opportunities.





### **Computer Science in Action**

This week the Computer Science class attended the 'Computer Science in Action' event at the Emmanuel Centre in London. This was an engaging opportunity for pupils to explore the intersection of computer science, cognitive science, and real-world applications. The event included several insightful lectures from industry professionals, which expanded on understanding of how these principles are applied in fields such as advertising, software development, and artificial intelligence. One of the most exciting topics covered was by Paul Kerzen, explaining the application of cognitive science in advertising.



The lecture included examples of successful advertising campaigns with Coca-Cola and Pepsi that used cognitive principles to effectively target specific audiences. The pupils were highly engaged and had the opportunity to expand their knowledge beyond the classroom.

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# **CV Writing Workshops**



Across Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday this week, all Year 10 pupils had a 2 hour CV writing workshop with the Department for Work and Pensions. The students were led through a template and had each component of their CV explained to them, to ensure they clearly understood why each part was important. The session helped answer questions raised by the pupils and build their confidence to complete their initial CV. The session explained to pupils how employers use CVs to shortlist candidates for interview and how AI software is increasingly being used by larger companies to identify stronger candidates more suitable to the role advertised. This is the first stage in getting all of Year 10 'work ready'. In January, Year 10s will each have a 30 minute 1:1 interview with an employer. They will use their CV during a mock interview with an employer. It is also intended that their CV will help them to obtain Work Experience, when all of Year 10 complete Work Experience 30th June - 4th July 2025. May I remind Year 10 parents that they are invited to attend the Parents' Information Evening for Work Experience on 11 December from 17:00-18:00. Here the full process will be explained and parents and students will have the opportunity to ask questions. Mrs A Frappell
