Alexander Fleming

In 1928 Fleming left a window open in his lab and bacteria had been killed by a mould - penicillin

Margaret Hutchinson Rousseau

Developed technology to mass produce penicillin

Florey & Chain

They were given funding by government to produce penicillin for war In 1941 USA entered war and gave \$80 million to fund research By 1943 penicillin was mass produced

Blood Transfusions

First performed by Blundell In 1894 Wright found chemicals which prevented it from clottina In 1901 Landsteiner discovered blood groups

Transplant Surgery **Christiaan Barnard** performed the first heart transplant surgery in South Africa in 1967

Plastic Surgery Harold Gillies set up a ward at Queen Mary's Hospital in 1917 to treat patients with facial injuries and pioneered skin graft techniques



Discovered by Röntgen in 1895 Used in hospitals from 1896 Not fully understood

Marie Curie helped get 200 X-ray units to hospitals and 20 mobile X-ray units during WWI to help detect internal injuries

Modern Surgical Methods Marie Curie's work on radiation helped to create successful treatments of cancer Laser Surgery can be used on eyes and cancer treatments Keyhole surgery uses microscopic cameras

Liberal reforms were introduced from 1906 such as 1908 Old Age

Pensioners Act and 1911 National Insurance Act



Bevan (Minister of Health) launched creation of NHS in 1948 which made healthcare free at the point of delivery

Antibiotic Resistance

- Some bacterium such as MRSA has become resistant to antibiotics
- Antibiotic resistance can be caused by patients not completing full course or overuse of antibiotics
