Sixth Form Dress Code

Sixth Form students are expected to dress smartly. They must adhere to the dress code, and, therefore, are expected to dress appropriately for school and not casually. **This includes during examination time.** Students will be required to go home and change if the Sixth Form Leadership team feels that their clothing is unsuitable <u>regardless of distance involved or cost</u> of transport.

What students should wear:

Tailored trousers:

Smart shoes/boots:

A tie (males must wear a tie at all times);

Shirt with collar, tucked in and top button fastened;

Smart blazer/jacket;

V neck jumper/cardigan;

Smart blouse/tops (midriff not showing – no low-cut tops);

Smart skirts (length should be no more than an inch off the knee or longer);

Smart dresses (length should be no more than an inch off the knee or longer).

What students are not permitted to wear:

Denim or jean-style trousers;

Leather or leather look;

Leggings;

Shorts/skorts;

Stretchy skirts/dresses;

Trainers;

Open-toed shoes;

Doc Martin boots;

Hugg Boots or slippers;

Hoodies/track tops;

T-shirts or polo shirts, including those with a slogan;

Hats or caps:

Tops with very thin straps or that expose midriff:

Extremes of hairstyle, hair colour, facial piercings or ear spacers.;

The final decision about whether a student's attire is at the discretion of the Sixth Form Leadership team.
